5. Principal's report: Diane Martinson

Activities/Events in the School

Cross-Country – successful practices and mini-meets with a large turnout of students and great enthusiasm – Final meet is this Thursday, October 19th at Trout Lake – 1:00-3:00. Thanks to Ms. Tang, Ms. Sula, Ms. Kafalas and Mr. Epting for coaching the team this year.

- Volleyball We have entered three teams in the inter-school volleyball league this year practices are just beginning. Thanks to Mr. Lorne, Mr. Chan and Mr. An for coaching.
- "Global Citizens Club" a new club focusing on local and world service and social responsibility themes and "giving back." The club members will be attending "We" Day tomorrow (Wed. Oct. 18) and are in the midst of organizing "We Scare Hunger" at the school a fund-raising/food collection event for the Greater Vancouver Food Bank which begins on Thursday, Oct. 19. They will be focusing on local and international themes over the year.
- Garden Program Lessons last session for students is next week (Oct. 23-27) thanks to PAC for this valuable program. Teachers will continue with the activities from the program throughout the year.

Math Program

- Grade 2-7 students are beginning a new Math program this year, in conjunction with our school goal focusing on Math
- Program is called "Maximizing Math" and has written and hands-on, station components
- Program meets the new BC Ministry of Education program standards
- Program overviewed by Ms. Stewardson, vice-principal (see below)

Ministry of Education program funding

- Carnarvon has been allotted \$13,000 to put towards materials/programs which support the new curriculum
- Staff has decided to put the funding towards the new Math program, 12 kits for a robotics program and Primary level home reading books.
- Breakdown of costing provided at the meeting (see Vice-Principal's report below)
- Staff will be presenting wish list at the November meeting

Communicating Student Learning Inquiry Project and Pilot Programs

- Group of interested primary and intermediate staff members and Ms. Martinson will be
 participating in the inquiry project which will meet with other schools, at the district
 level, four times over the year and discuss and share ideas regarding way to
 communicate student learning
- Inquiry group will meet at the school level and try out and work with a number of methods of communicating – digital etc.
- The district Pilot Project will involve a group of teachers (combination of Primary and Intermediate) who are interested in piloting the new reporting format that will officially begin next year giving us an opportunity to have a say and give feedback for the final format and documentation.
- The Pilot project is for students between K and Gr. 9 and consists of 5 opportunities to report out to parents (one written in January and one in June, the student self-assessment, and three other formats of reporting).
- The report consists of two pages anecdotal strengths and areas of continued work and a sliding scale of progress (subject by subject)

- Intermediate students will not receive letter grades but they are available upon parent request.
- Power Point presentation from the VSB District shown

New Math program for grades 2-7

- Maximizing Math developed by Edmonton school district
- Math work station packages uses games to teach skills
- Student expected to do self-evaluations
- Tests can be just 1 question but are comprehensive, testing multiple skills
- Will use Pro D Days to help teachers implement program
- Cost Approx \$2900, including \$1000 for teacher supplies and \$6/copy for student workbook

Robotics

- Vex IQ Robots meets requirements of Applied Science & Technology curriculum same as kits are being used in high school programs
- \$5500 for 12 kits
- To be introduces class by class, each class will have approx. 1 month with kits
- Includes intro to Block Coding
- Program to start by Christmas

Primary home reading

- Grade 2 levels readers required levels 16-30
- \$1800
