- Question: What are the current requirements for class size and is Carnarvon meeting Them? Answer: Class size maximums 22 in primary, 30 in intermediate (2 less for a split class)
- What's new? Currently working on weekly newsletters instead of monthly, crosswalk monitors have started.
- Safe Arrival to be school based. There will be a designated phone line for parents to call if their child will be absent. Classroom teachers will be asked to list students they weren't aware would be away. Office will match up list with calls received at designated line. Parent will be asked to call prior to 8:15 am if possible.
- Question: Grade 7 students told they won't be able to leave school grounds at lunchtime as per previous years. Please comment on reasons, thoughts. Answer: School is responsible for students during school hours even if parents are ok with students leaving the campus. Grade 7 students met with Ms. Martinson and discussed their reasons for wanting to leave the school grounds at lunch Ms. Martinson told them that she would take their views under consideration and get back to them. Diane to get back to students tomorrow on final decision.
