j) Direct Drive fundraising - Kerry Kenwood

- Been some clarification on the VSB's ability to issue tax receipts for donations made to schools by means of PACs
- PACs are unable to issue tax receipts
- VSB can only issue receipts only for donations that are intended to be used for supporting board/school programs and the board must maintain custody of these donations
- What this means is that any directly donated funds must be held in either the Carnarvon school-based account OR the Carnarvon VSB-based account (not PAC account) IF a tax receipt is required
- Donations can be made the following ways:
 - cheque made out to Carnarvon Elementary and this will money will be held in the Carnarvon school-based account – tax receipt will be issued
 - 2. online via the school cash website and this money will be deposited into the Carnarvon VSB-based account tax receipt will be issued
 - 3. cheque made out to Carnarvon PAC and if donor would like a tax receipt, these funds will then be given to the school to be held in the Carnarvon school-based account tax-receipt issued
 - 4. cheque made out to Carnarvon PAC and if donor doesn't want a tax receipt, these funds will be deposited in the PAC account tax-receipt NOT issued
- in order to use any of the funds donated to the school that are being held in either of the school accounts, the PAC must communicate anything that it would like to be funded and the board/school pays the vendors directly
- these funds can only be used for school programming and items, not to support PAC events or fundraisers
- A Direct Drive letter will be drafted to reflect the changes in the system so everyone is aware of where their donation is going
- Discussion followed about the fact that the PAC is no longer in full control of directly
 donated money. In which case, to make this work PAC should designate certain items on
 the Wish List that will be funded by school/VSB-controlled funds. The school is then
 responsible for paying for these out of these funds. Those items are out of PAC's hands
 unless that pot of money runs out, the school can then ask the PAC to pay the difference.
